 May you always be proud remembering the traditions our school represents.

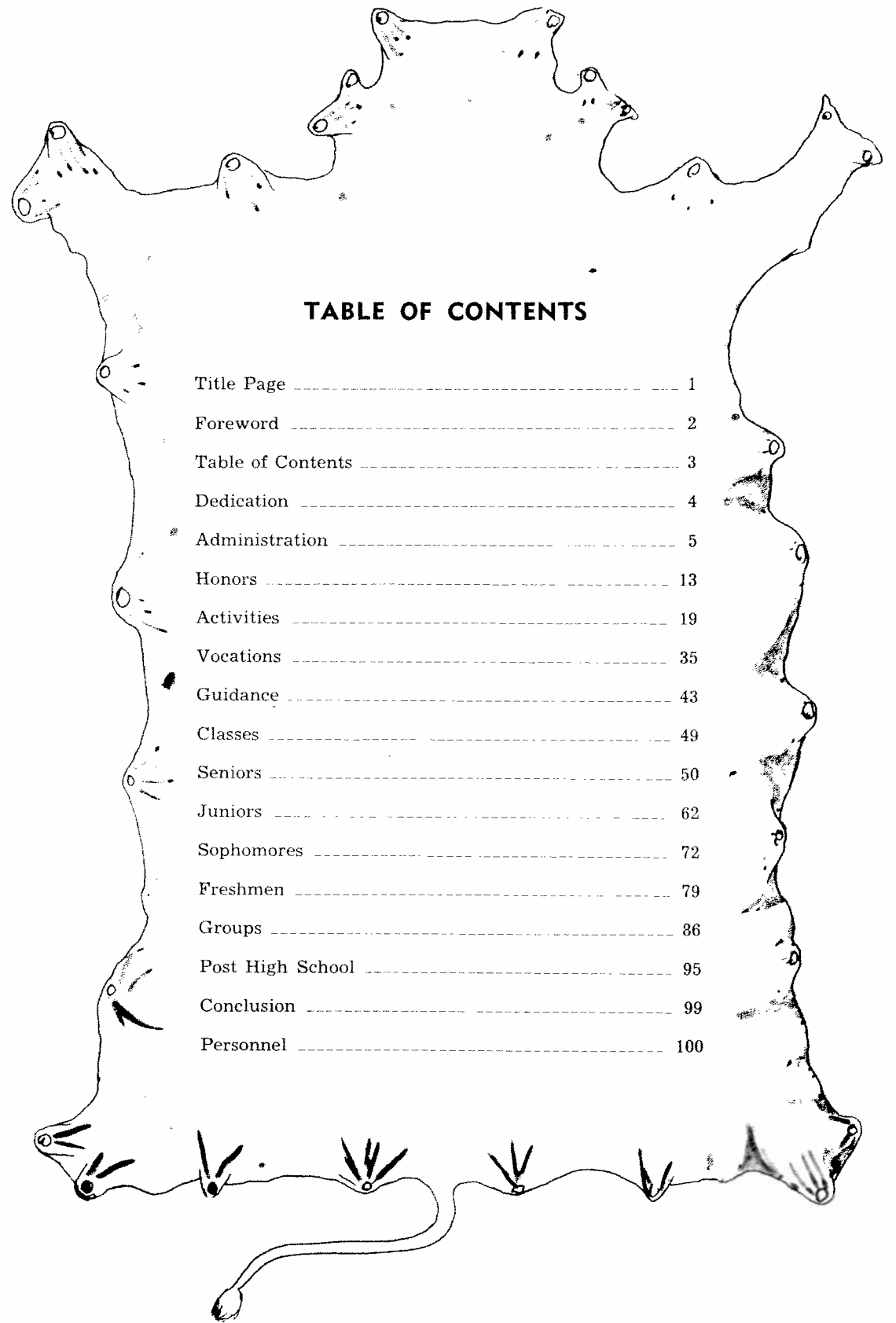

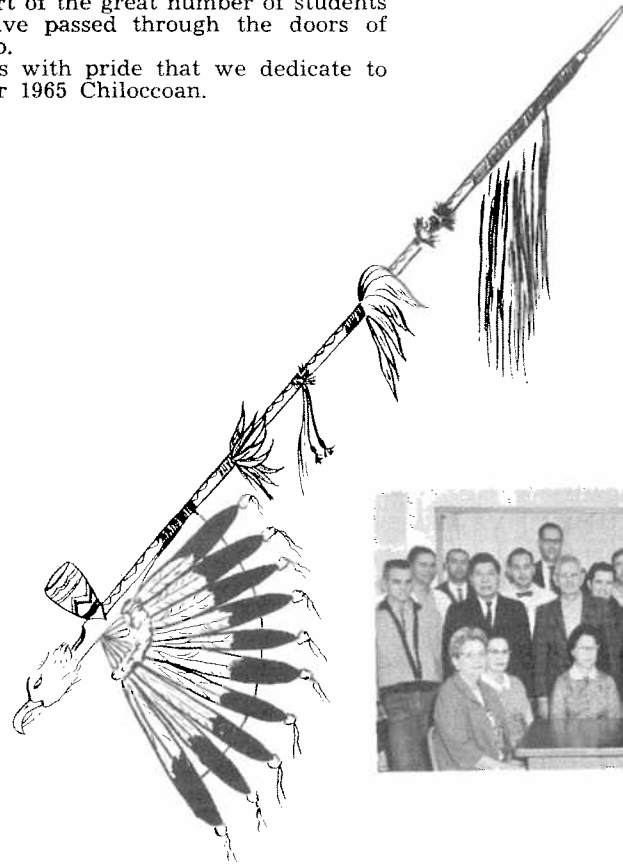

To the Alumni of Chilocco Indian School. As we pause and look back at our years at Chilocco and at the heritage our school represents we too are proud to have walked this way.

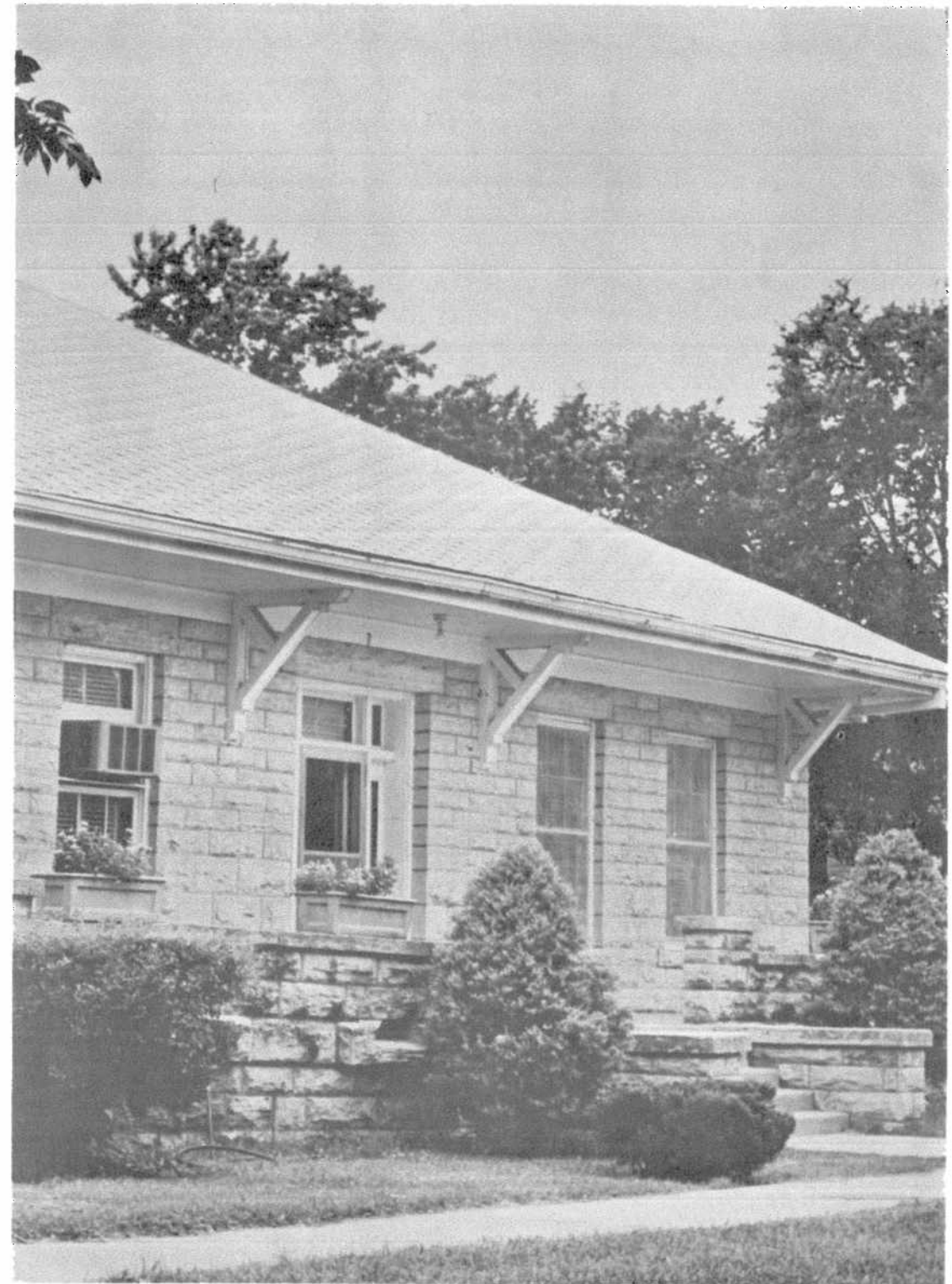

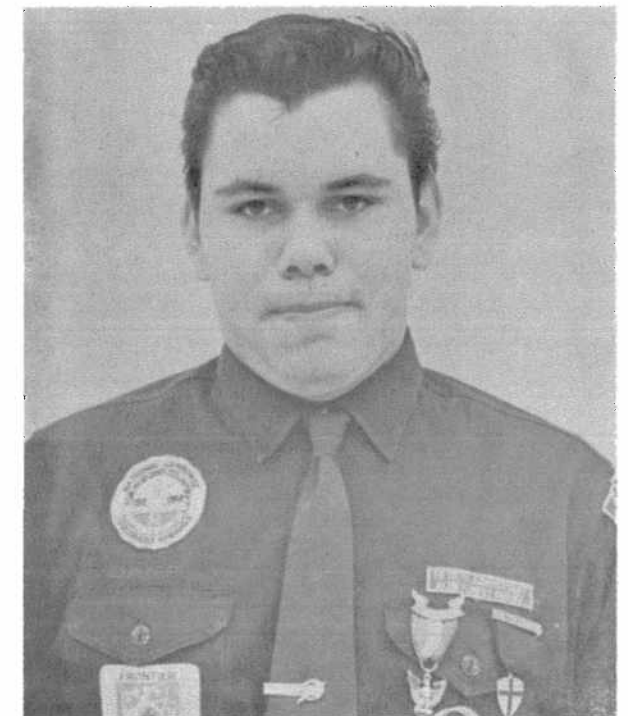

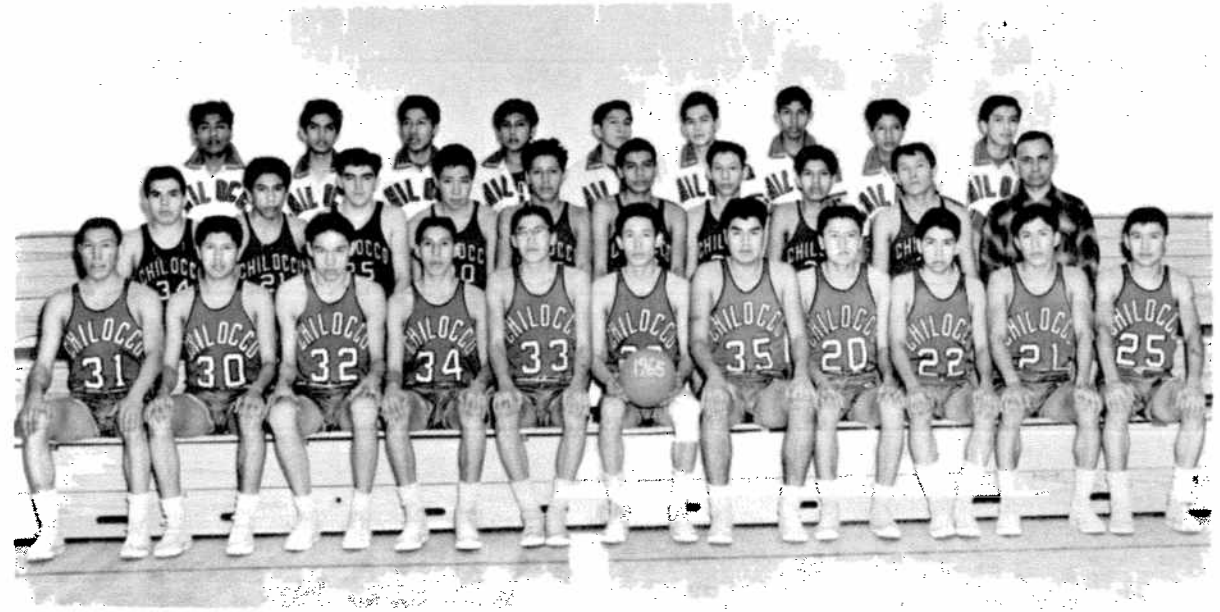

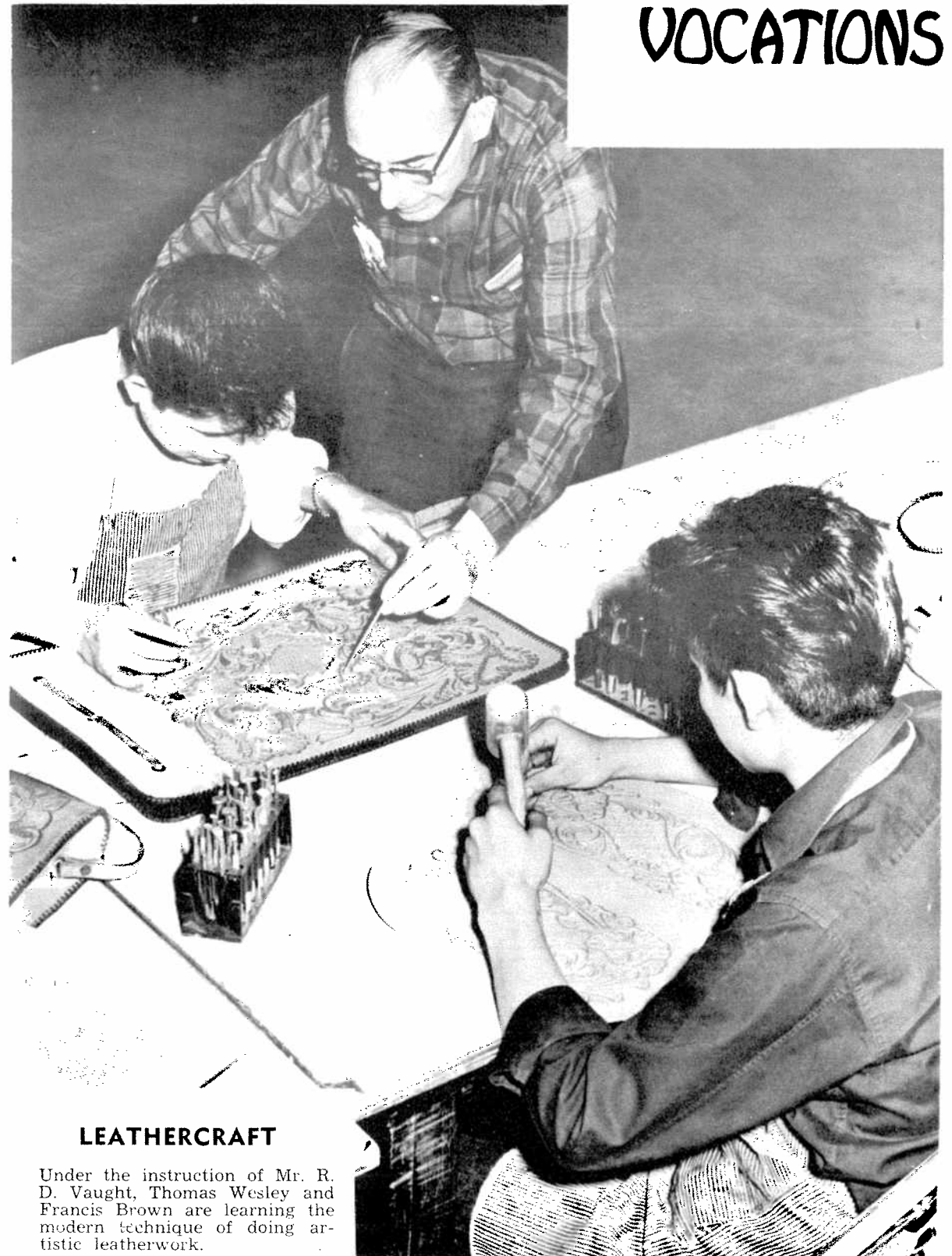

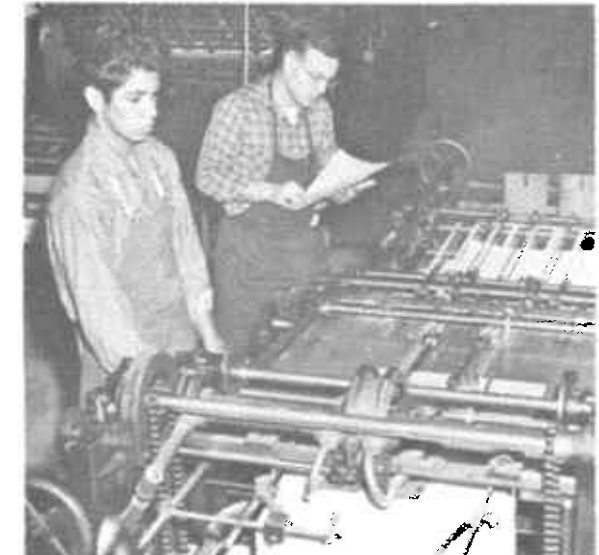

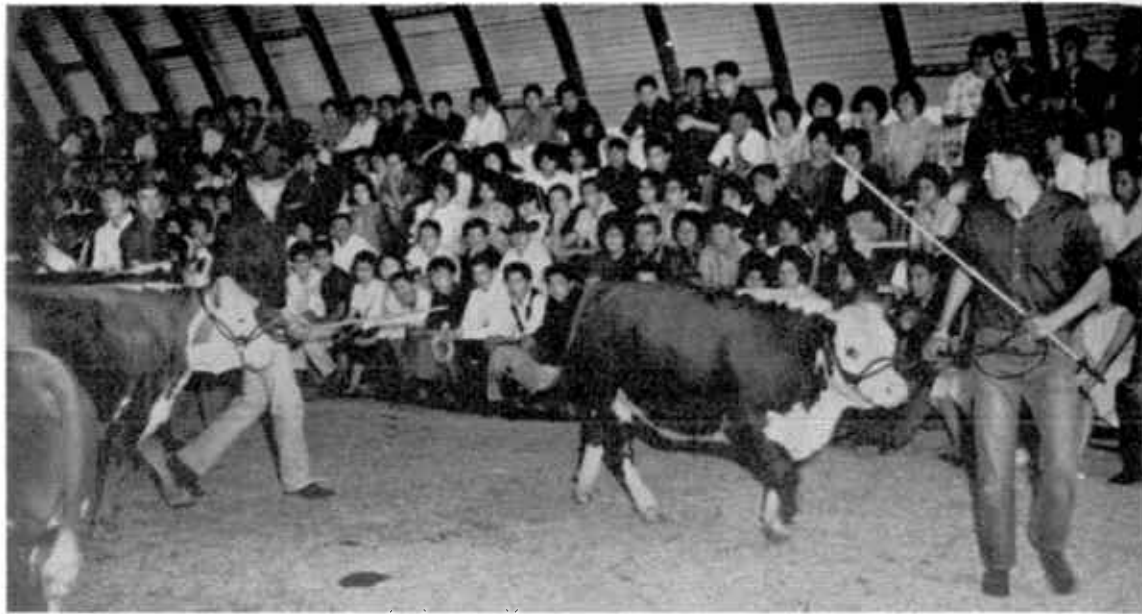

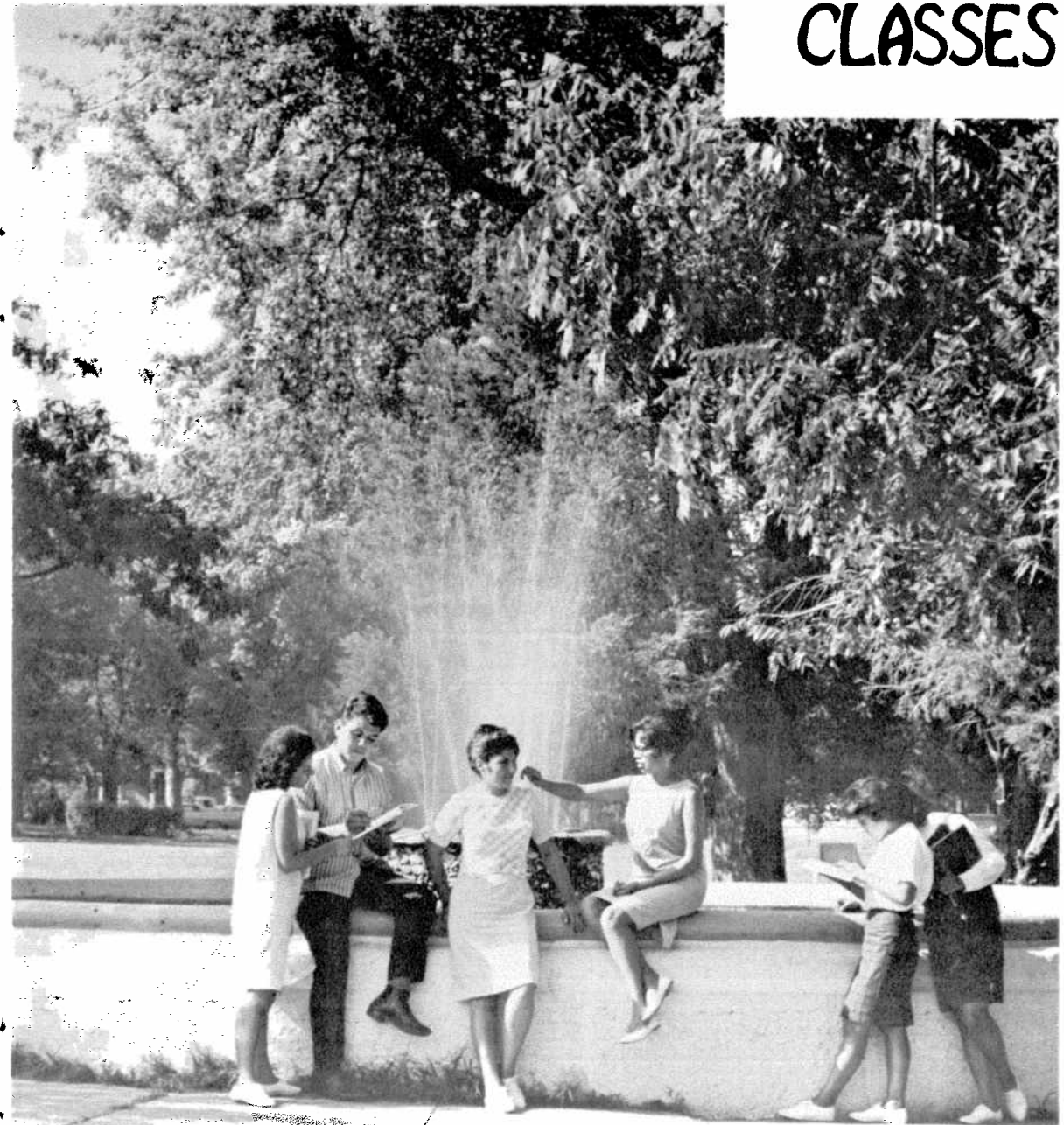
