Pre-Vocational Department



The new pre-vocational building was opened in October of the 1963-64 school year.

The department offers one and two hour practical arts classes for freshmen and sophomore boys and two and three hour pre-vocational courses for juniors and seniors


One hour courses include Woodworking, Foundry and Pattern Making, Beginning Electricity, Small Motors and Sheet Metal. Two hour courses for sophomores include Masonry, Machine Lathe Operation, Beginning Welding, Metal Work and Advanced Small Motors.

Junior and senior level pre-vocational courses are Auto Mechanics, Carpentry and Mill Work, Drafting, Dry Cleaning, Body and Fender, Electricity, Painting, Shoe Repair and Leathercraft, Sheet Metal, Printing and Welding.

Dry Cleaning is offered as a vocation for post high school students.









Agriculture Department



The Agriculture Department offers high school boys training in four major areas: Animal Science, Plant Science, Land Management and Agriculture Engineering. Heavy Epuipment is taught as a vocation for post high school students. Animal Science provides training in the care of beef cattle, sheep, swine and horses.

Plant Science trains students in the production and management of field crops, fruit production and greenhouse management.

Land Management provides students instruction and experience in soil conservation. Students discover for themselves the causes of soil erosion and learn how it can be controlled.

Agricultural Engineering provides training and experience in the operation, care and repair of farm machinery.





Home Economics Department



LEUPP HALL

Known to students as the "chowhall," Leupp Hall is the home of the Home Economics Department.

One hour practical arts classes are offered in Marriage and Family Relations, Personal Health and Fitness, Wise Use of Leisure Time, Selection and Care of and Repair of Clothing, Nutrition for the Young Adult and Occupations.

Two hour courses include Advanced Foods, Advanced Sewing, Nursing Arts, Junior Foods, Food Service and Culinary Arts.

Three hour pre-vocational courses in Food Service and Culinary Arts are offered to seniors. Cosmetology is taught to post high school students as a vocation.





Under construction for the past year, this impressive modern building will be the home for 320 boys when opened in September of 1966.




